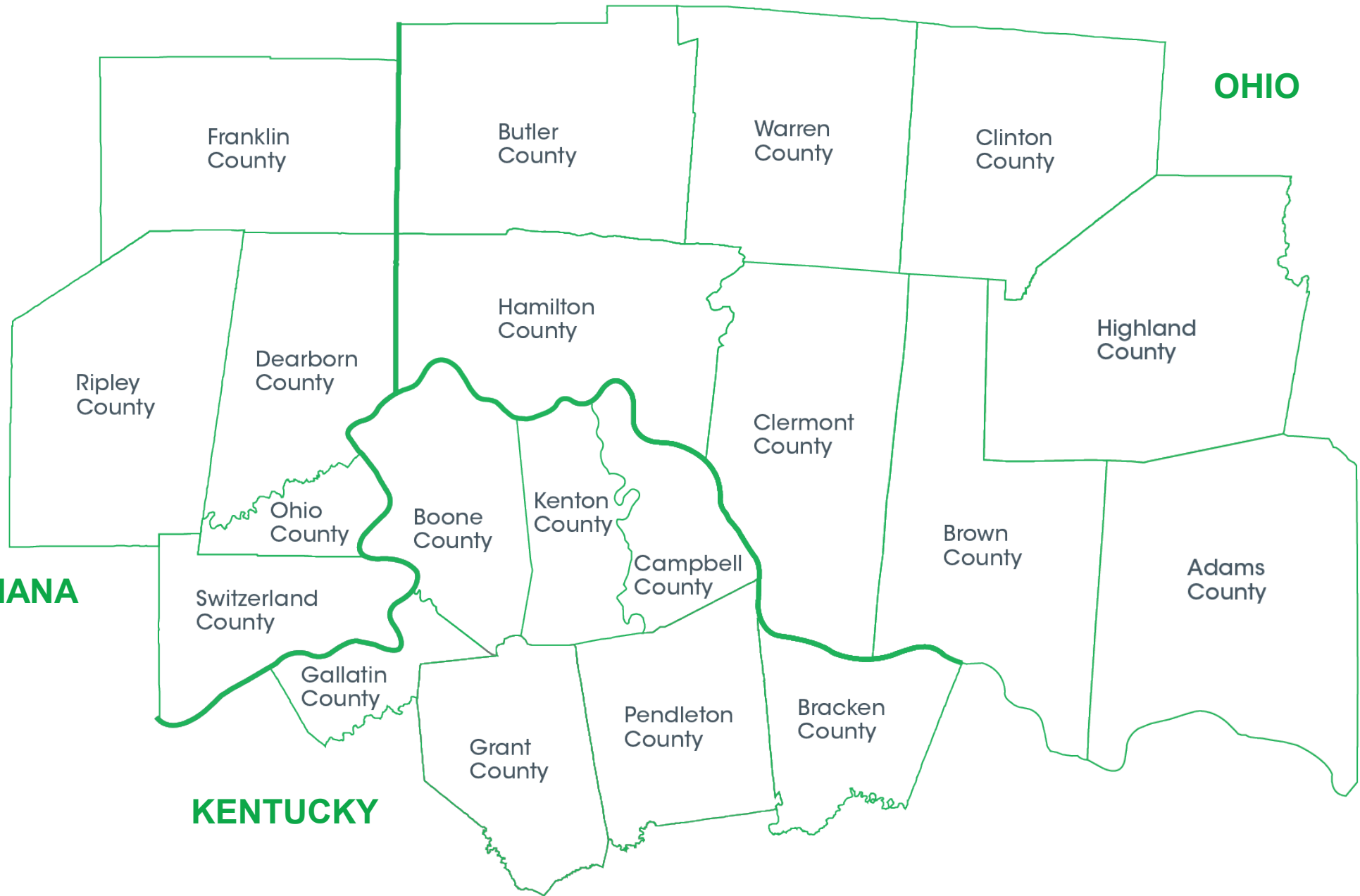

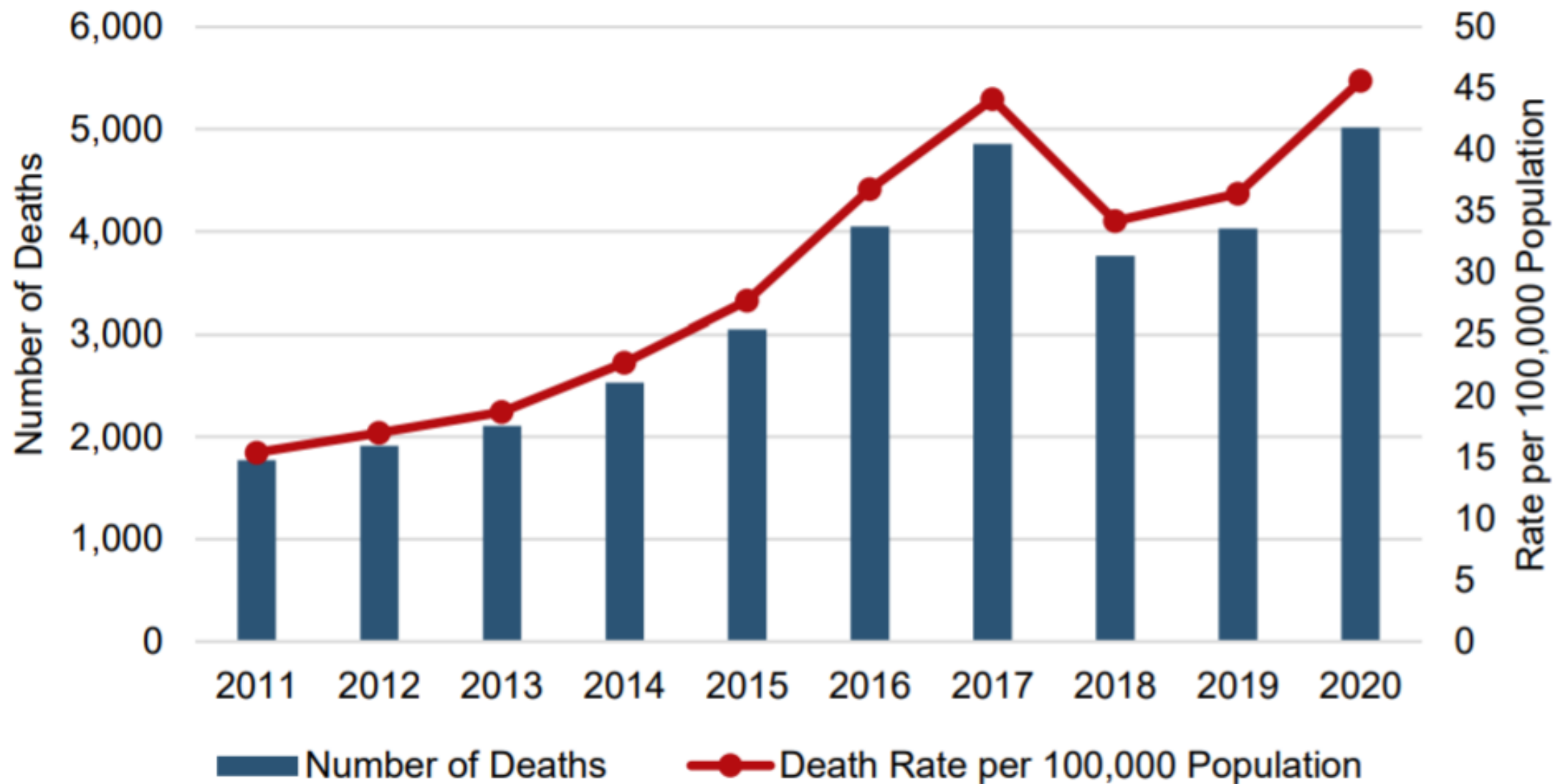
Executive Order required that RecoveryOhio **listen** and create a report of **community needs**

Current Overdose Trends

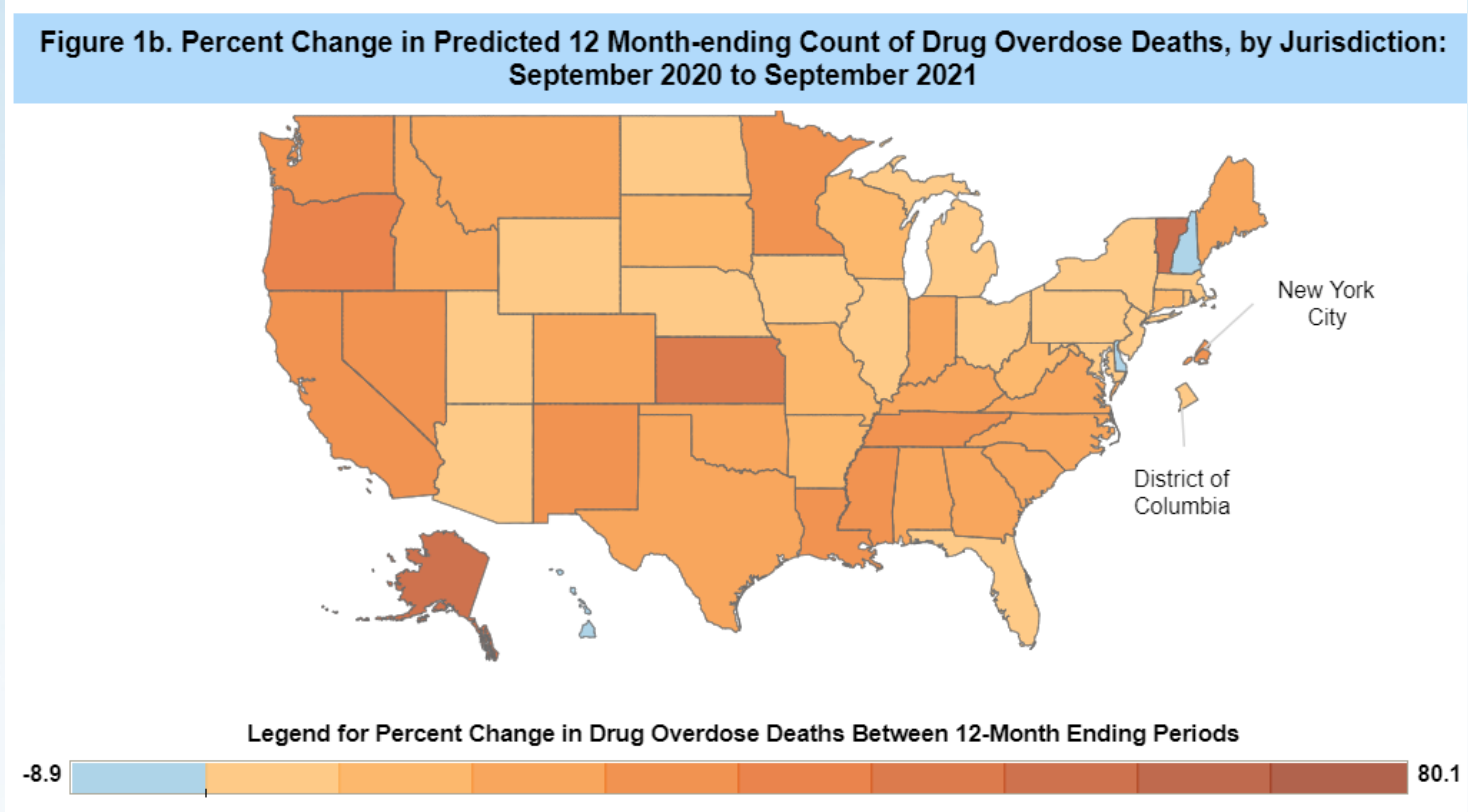
Number and Age-Adjusted Rate of Unintentional Drug Overdose Deaths by Year, Ohio, 2011-2020

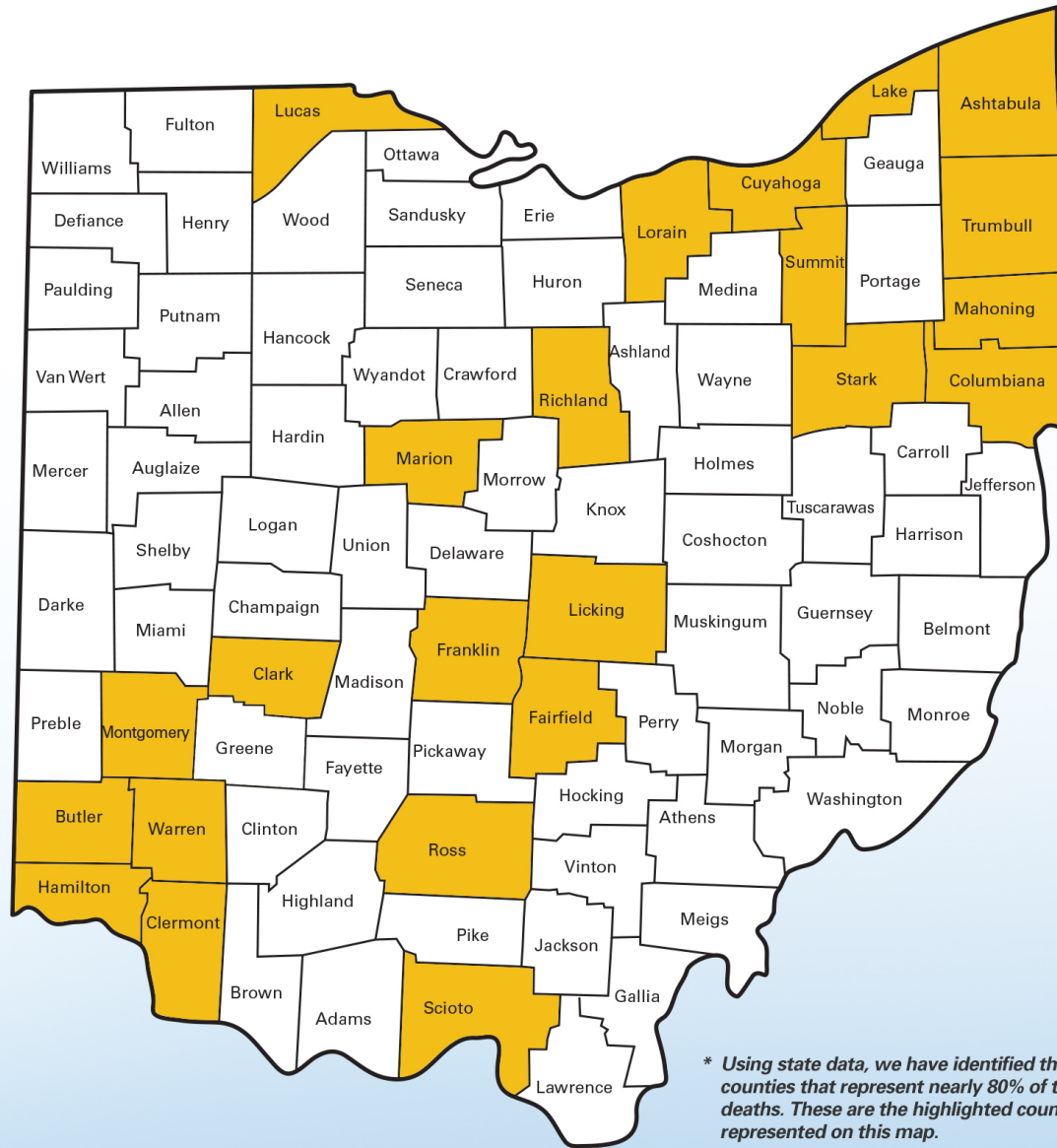

OH Against OD Campaign

- Harm reduction campaign providing education on practices that can reduce the risk of unintentional death from an overdose.
- Increases awareness around the adulterated drug supply.
- Tested among people who are actively using and people in recovery.



IT MIGHT NOT BE YOUR USUAL DRUG.
Fentanyl is making drugs deadlier.

OH AGAINST OD

No drug is safe, but if you're using:

- CARRY NALOXONE** In case of overdose, use naloxone.
- NEVER BE ALONE** Talk to friends and family about what to do if you overdose.
- CALL 911** Get help as quickly as possible.
